VISIT THE WONDERS OF THE WORLD

What makes a place a World Wonder? The "Ancient Seven Wonders of the World" were determined by Philo of Byzantium in 250 B.C. The number seven was chosen by the Greeks, who believed it represented perfection and plenty.

Of the original Seven Wonders of the World, only the Great Pyramids of Giza remain; the rest have faded to dust and memory. Because of the way time changed these great places, some consider newer places as the "Seven Wonders of our time".

My Stay-at-Home Lab Shows How Face Coverings Can Slow the Spread of Disease Cover smart.

Matthew Staymates, a NIST mechanical engineer and fluid dynamicist, made a video showing how face coverings can slow the spread of disease. He creates a high-speed visualization of breathing and coughing -- with and without a face covering. His experiment shows the flow of water droplets on which viruses attach, illustrating that a face covering controls the direction and amount of droplets expelled, which can slow the spread of disease.
